In partnership with Sonoma County Regional Parks, Sonoma County Library is offering Regional Parks Discovery Packs!

A "Regional Parks Discovery Pack" is available at each library branch and includes a backpack filled with a parking pass good at all 56 Regional Parks, a parks map, trail itineraries, hiking tips, wildlife guides, and other information to help them enjoy self-guided adventures in the parks.

The Discovery Pack program was developed to promote community health and well-being by increasing opportunities for residents to visit and learn about their parks. Each pack is available for check out for up to seven days and includes materials in English and Spanish. Discovery Pack backpacks will be available for checkout on Monday, January 29th at all Library branches. Each Discovery Pack includes materials that need to be returned and some items that can be kept.

- Learner took a placement exam at SRJC in English. His score was 73 out of 75. I'm encouraging his being in a class for more practice and group work.
- Learner is gradually gaining confidence in knowledge of sentence structure and parts of speech.
- ♥ We've been using the box of 101 idioms. About halfway through, learner began writing a story with the cards we worked on that week. We read and correct it the next week, and the story grows."
