


**Wake : The Hidden History of Women-Led Slave Revolts**





**My Dear Detective : Mitsuko's Case Files. 1**

by Sharon Cameron (she/her) - Y CAMERON



by Isabel Ibañez (she/her) - Y IBANEZ



by Sarah Raughley (she/her) - Y RAUGHLEY


