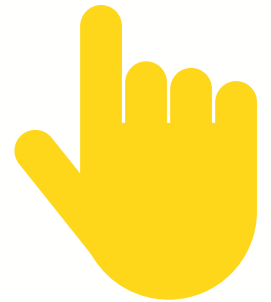

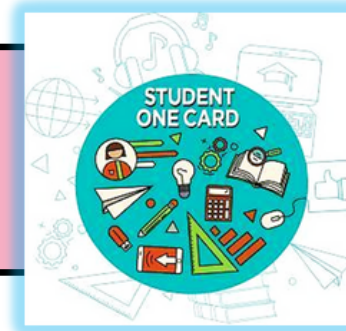


YOU WILL NEED:

WHAT IS A STUDENT ONECARD



Student OneCard is a digital library account that allows you to access library books and online tools.

Students are able to use their Student ID Numbers as Sonoma County Library account numbers.

SIGNING-IN



You will need to know your:

- School District prefix
- Your Student ID
- Your 4-Digit Pin

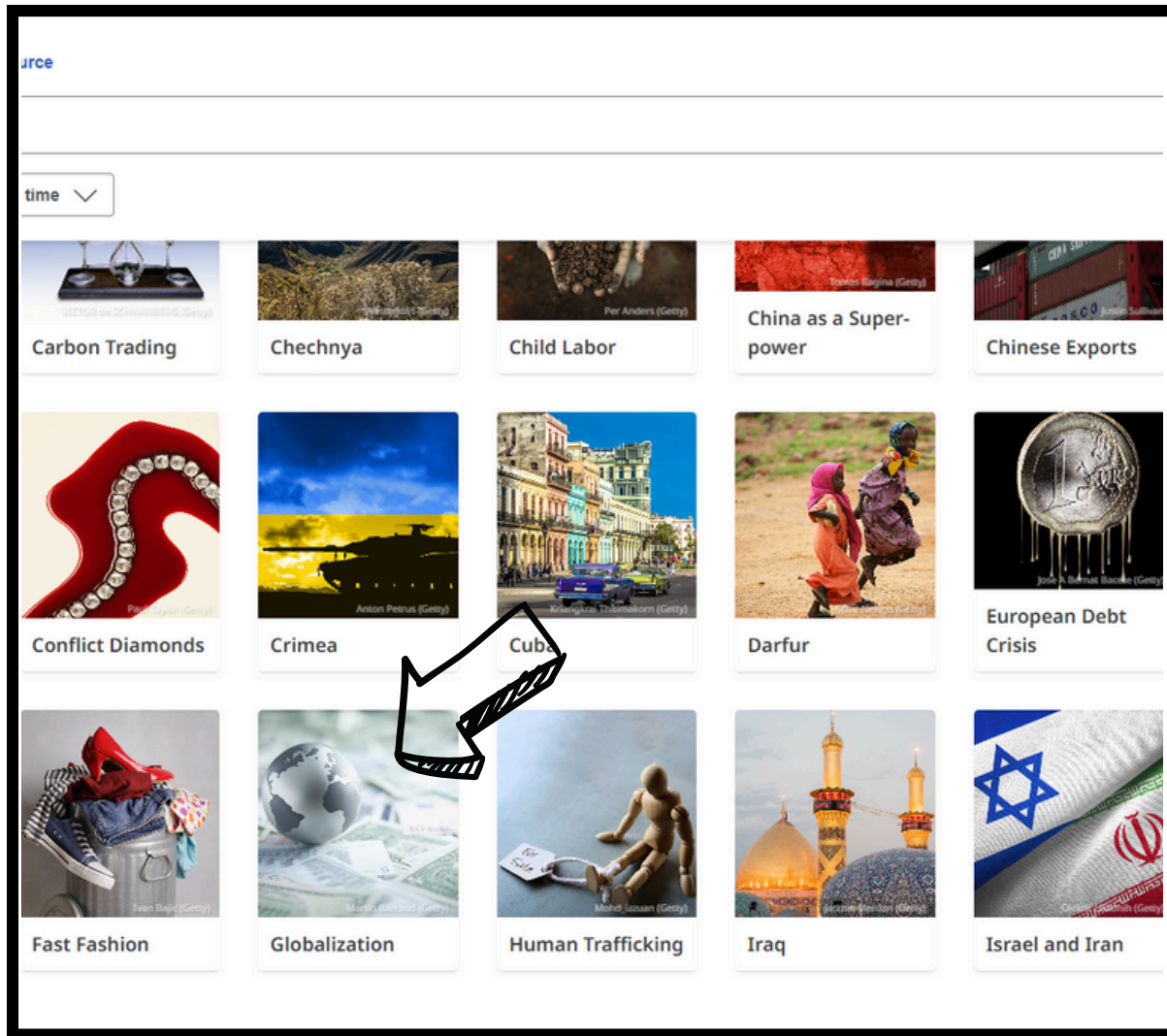
