

Library Commission Chair Deborah Doyle **Banned Books Week** was founded in 1982 by the American Library Association after a wave of censorship from the conservative Moral Majority. In 2023, Banned Books Week was October 1-7. Stronger, more corrosive attempts to ban books are happening right now in 37 states involving legislatures, schools, public libraries and elections. According to a recent PEN report, attempts to remove books this year have

increased by 16 percent over last year's record total of 2,571 titles. Sadly, we are not immune in California and must be vigilant. We are proud that the Sonoma County Library has strong policies protecting your freedom to read.
