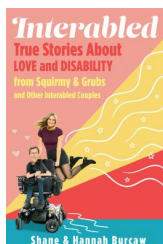

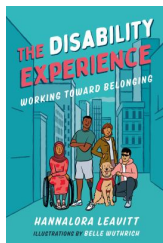
The accounts in this collection ask readers to think about disabled people not as individuals who need to be "fixed", but as members of a community with it's own history, culture, and movements.

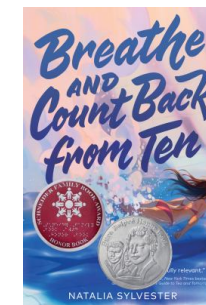
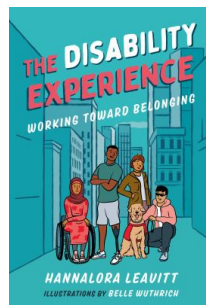
This nonfiction book for teens provides a history of disability, describes types of disabilities and examines the challenges faced by people living with disabilities.

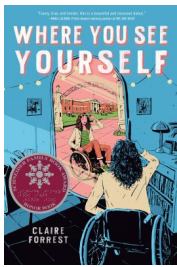

by Allison Sweet Grant (she/her) - Y GRANT

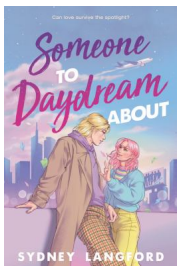

by Chatham Greenfield (they/them) - Y GREENFIELD

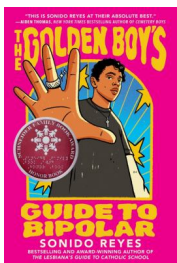
Stuck in a time loop, queer Jewish teens Phoebe and Jess start to fall for each other, causing chronically ill Phoebe to worry about a future that may never come.

by Alison Stine (she/her) - Y STINE

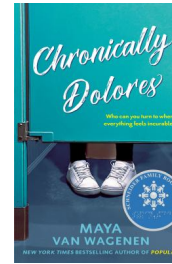

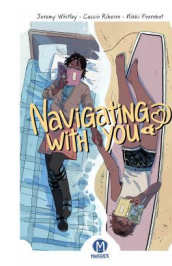
